This research is based on a pilot proposal for linking Moche pre-Hispanic heritage and the academic community: Larco Museum - AXIS Art - Geometric Drawing Course, School of Fine Arts (PUCP). The purpose is to design a learning model with strategies of drawing, visual-spatial thinking and ITs. It seeks to involve freshmen of Fine Arts and Design careers in morphological research of Moche pre-Hispanic products with representation systems of two and three dimensions.

The strategy of drawing as appropriation is a knowledge and self-appraisal means. The geometric study of analysis, synthesis and interpretation, allows a connection between the School of Fine Arts freshmen and the Moche heritage. This approach helps to raise the curiosity to discover and research the past, create proposals in the present and strengthen the identity of new generations.
