

Productive chain and clusters of cooking-farming alliance: restrictions and possibilities

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The agricultural-alimentary sector constitutes a very extensive chain of subsectors going from the agricultural-farming rural producers, artisanal fishermen, agricultural-industrial companies, food processing companies, Peruvian gastronomy restaurants in Peru and abroad, gastronomy schools and a big variety of several good and related service suppliers in all the chain. The agricultural-alimentary sector also presents two comparative advantages: high agro-biodiversity that enables a wide offering of products, and good national and international gastronomy reputation, which enables good and service export development.

The work aims at a comprehensive approach to gastronomy articulation with other sectors, such as tourism and services. In the same way, it analyzes the impact produced on economy, as well as actors and networks generated in different chain links. For the analysis, it is taken into account not only the economic dimension but also the social, cultural and management dimension to become aware of internal and external limits and possibilities thereof. Likewise, it is aimed at approaching to potential and productive chain restrictions and networks of actors involved in articulating the gastronomy/ rural production/ fishing /services.

The sustainable development approach requires *per se* an interdisciplinary work which constitutes a main added value to the previous works existing about the issue.
